school. He decided that life would be much better if he lived with a different family and so moved out of our home and into

theirs. I felt hurt and angry. They weren't the ones who had cared for him when he was sick, or washed his clothes, or cooked his meals. I was jealous.

Unchecked jealousy can often cost us the very things we fear losing. In Saul's case, he lost the beloved harp player that could soothe him, he forced the divided loyalties of his son Jonathan and daughter Michal. He divided the allegiance of the nation of Israel. Most of all, he did not acknowledge or respect God's plans for the Israelites.

I think it was the recognition that God holds the plans for my family that helped me overcome my jealousy. I realized that there were bigger things at stake than my own hurt feelings. I wanted to maintain a friendship with the other family. I definitely wanted things to turn out well for my son, whoever he chose to live with. In other words, there were issues bigger than me.




