POURED OUT

So the three mighty men broke through the Philistine lines, drew water from the well near the gate of Bethlehem and carried it back to David. But he refused to drink it; instead, he poured it out before the Lord. 2 Samuel 23:16

David didn't just pour out the water; he poured it out before the Lord. There are lots of "pouring outs" in Scripture. Water poured out can't be collected back in. What was the situation in each of these?

allowing Satan to have his way with David just a little longer, so that David could see and understand the condition of his heart. Maybe God turned David over to Satan's whims much like we allow our children room to fail so that they can learn to be stronger when the bigger stuff comes along. I'm so glad that we can trust God to do that for us. I'm so glad that God is so powerful that the most evil plans of Satan can be turned into God's tool for our benefit.

Elaine Denman, at the 2007 Women Walking with God conference, said "God does not save us **from** things, He saves us **in** things." I would take that a bit further and say that not only is God saving us in things, but He is also saving us **to** things and **for** things. He isn't always quick to pull us out of hot water, because He is the one that allowed us to fall in. Maybe a little heat now is just what we need to avoid the fire later.

David was quick to recognize and confess his sin, and turn from it, as God knew he would be. David's reliance on God was renewed, even as he was choosing his punishment.

Having spiritual advisors in our life is crucial. They anoint us as God's chosen ones by reminding us whose we are, what we have to offer Him and the importance of living faithfully. Not only did David have prophets, he also had friends. In fact, David's friendship with Jonathan is one of the most well known there has ever been. There were other friends for David as well. In 1 Chron. 27 we find a list of David's officials. There were men in charge of the olive oil, the sheep, the watchtowers, the camels and the vineyards. There is Jonathan (a different one) and Ahithopel who were his counselors. There was Jehiel, the man in charge of his sons. And finally, in verse 33 we find Hushai the Arkite.

1 Sam. 24 and 1 Chron. 21

This is the same location (Mt. Moriah) that Abraham was willing to sacrifice his son Isaac, but stopped at the last moment by God. In gratitude, Abraham made an offering to God at this same location.

What is the price for the site in 1 Chron. 21:25?

Why the discrepancy?

We are later (2 Chron. 3:1) told that this would be the site on which Solomon would build the temple. Today it is the location of the Muslim mosque, the Dome of the Rock. On the edge of the Temple Mount the Western Wall still stands, also known as the Wailing Wall where Jews still go to offer their prayers, written on notes, folded and inserted in crevices. (Beers. 130)



GAD

We met Gad, the prophet, briefly in 1 Sam. 22:5 when he advised David to run to the forest of Hereth. Now he appears again to speak God's word to David regarding the punishment for the census. 1 Chron. 29:29 indicates that like Samuel and Nathan, he wrote a record of the events of David's reign.




