# THE MYSTERY OF GOD

We always want to **KNOW**. For some the questions are: What is our favorite celebrity arguing with their spouse about? Where does our neighbor spend his evenings? Others ask: Why does salt thaw the ice? Where does the universe end? Job had questions too: Why do bad things happen to good people? Where is God when I need Him?

I think we want to know because it makes us feel safer, more in control. We want to know because it makes us feel powerful. It makes us feel like we have a handle on the world and people around us. God can be a bit disconcerting to us because we are not yet capable of fully knowing Him. He doesn't change, but my idea of Him does as I am forced to stretch my previous conceptions in my evolving relationship with Him. No longer does He fit, even in my own imagination, within the image that I have for Him. I cannot pin Him down, or define Him, or make Him behave the way that I would if I was God. His ways are not my ways. For now, there is a separation between our understanding and the full reality of God. We know enough, but He is still full of surprises. He is still a mystery that defies our full understanding. He is so MUCH that He has to hide Himself from us because we could not bear all of Him (Ex.3:6). Even Jesus said in Jn. 16:12 that He could not tell the disciples everything because they would not be able to bear it at that time. Not only are we unable to control God, we cannot even fully understand Him. Yet, John 17:3 says "knowing" God and the One that He sent is eternal life. What kind of "knowing" does Jesus mean?

- Knowing that He is real, like I know, or believe, that George Washington was real based on the available evidence?
- Knowing what the Bible tells me about God in the same way that I know about George Washington from the history books I read as a school child?
- Knowing Him in the intimate friendship way that John 15 describes and I will never hope to have with George Washington?
- Knowing God so well that no mystery remains, even better than Martha Washington knew her own husband?

What are we responsible to know, and what are we not really expected to understand? 1 Corinthians 13:8-13 describes the limits of our knowledge of God. It also says that a day will come when we will be able to see God face to face. The mystery will be over and we will fully understand, and fully know.

What are you most looking forward to understanding or knowing about God?


