I tend to separate out and categorize things. It makes them seem clear and well defined. But the Spirit of God wisps through my fingers at my every attempt to pin Him down. I can't separate Him from God because God without His spirit would not be God any more than you or I would be who we are without our spirit. Some people have a spirit of meanness, while others have a quiet and gentle spirit. When we say someone is "spirited," we usually mean that the force of their personality is so strong that there is no mistaking what they are like. If they are in the room you know it. They vigorously and energetically live out who they are. The presence of God's spirit in that gathering of believers on the day of Pentecost was unmistakable. God is spirited. People, as beings made in God's image, also have a spirit. The same Hebrew word, "ruah" is used for the spirit of both man and God. We are spiritual beings equipped to relate with a spiritual God. God's spirit is holy. If the presence, power, and personality of God has become our own spirit, then we are indeed a new creation! There are certain qualities that give evidence that it is God's spirit that is present. We are familiar with the fruits of the Spirit, but what are some other ways that God's spirit manifests itself? The human spirit is limited in the scope of its reach, but still we can sometimes experience it even when we are not in the person's immediate presence. God's spirit is so powerful it can proceed to express itself in ways that make Him seem to us as a separate powerful being, with His own name: The Holy Spirit. That is true, but we must not allow that to make Him seem like an optional accessory. We must remember that the Holy Spirit is the spirit of God so it would be impossible for Him to behave in a way contrary to God. It is impossible for us to accept God without also welcoming His spirit. The Holy Spirit must be more than a visiting voice that occasionally whispers a suggestion to us. He must be more than the barely acknowledged guest in our home that we catch only occasional glimpses of. He cannot stay on the periphery of our faith until we figure out what it is we are supposed to do with Him. We must allow the spirit of God to be our Lord and Master, or He will be nothing to us at all.

GOD'S CREATIVE SPIRIT

We first meet the spirit of God in the second verse of the Bible. We are told that the "Spirit of God was hovering over the waters." Spirit is "ruah" in Hebrew, and its meanings include words like: air, breath, emotions, life, and mind. (Key Word Study Bible 1550) So apparently the Spirit is the very breath and life of God, His mind and His feelings? And what does it mean that He was "hovering"? The King James Version uses the word moving. The word actually means "brooding". Is that brooding like when I'm thinking through a tough issue, or brooding like a mother

hen who has parked herself on a nest for the purpose of bringing life forth from the promise beneath her?

THE GREAT EQUALIZER

Joel 2:28 says that God will pour out His Spirit on all people: old and young, men and women, all those who accept Him will receive Him. When Peter spoke to the amazed crowd on the day of Pentecost, he quoted the passage from Joel. In a society of rigid social classes, and age requirements, this was a powerful statement. The religious practices of the day defined the age at which one could begin to serve God, if you were of the right tribe and the right gender. Even more, we will later see the Spirit indwelling even the Gentiles. There appears a new standard for determining who has been approved by God for service to Him. If the Spirit is present, then that serves as the seal of God's presence in them.
