


A MYSTERIOUS FRIENDSHIP John 15-17

## **TIPS** for parents and teachers

Here are some optional activities if you have time. Since our class is only 45 minutes, we don't have much time for extras, but once every quarter I try to schedule a fun get together and incorporate some of these into it as a sort of fun review. Also, as a parent I try to incorporate some of these into our at home or in the car times. Encourage your parents to use these too!

Play a game where each student tries to think of something that is true, and something that is not true about them. Have them state both as a fact, and see if their classmates know which of the two is true. I have some siblings in my class, so they had to get creative with some obscure information! The point is, can we know someone even if we don't know everything about them?

Some questions to ask:

Can we know someone if we don't know anything about them?

Will we be able to know everything about God?


How much do we need to know?

Does God try to stump us like in our game?

Another game that makes a fun review in whatever amount of time you have is to name a topic or event from John and have the kids use their Bibles to find the chapter. Whoever names it correctly first gets one point. This helps them get a feel for the layout of the book as a whole.

If a nearby neighbor has a grapevine, walk over and take a look at it. Discuss John 15 while looking at and handling the vine. If it is wintertime and it looks like a dead tangle, there is a lesson in

that too. We all bear more fruit in some seasons than others!
