WORSHIP

We have worship music, a worship leader and a worship service, but what exactly is worship? The Encarta dictionary defines the verb worship this way: 1.to treat somebody or something as divine and show respect by engaging in acts of prayer and devotion 2. To take part in a religious service 3. To love, admire, or respect somebody or something greatly and perhaps excessively or unquestioningly. The Greek word for worship in Hebrews 12:28 (latreuo) means to minister to God. (Meyers) How can we possibly minister to God? What do we have to offer Him? He doesn't need His slippers brought to Him. He doesn't need us to bring Him a cool glass of water. So, how can we minister to God?

What does Matt. 25:37-40 say?

Every week we gather with other believers to worship God in a service where we praise and adore Him. We sing songs of praise, lift up our prayers to Him, and learn more about Him - For about an hour. Then what? What is the worship that God finds acceptable? How do we show Him appropriate reverence and awe with our lives? Why does the writer of Hebrews remind us that our God is a consuming fire? How is that to affect our worship of Him?

Hebrews 11 lists all kinds of people of faith, faith that presumably led them to acceptable worship of God for without faith it is impossible to please God. But if you look at the descriptions of these people's faith, it is always for what their faith prompted them to **do**. Noah's faith built an ark and preserved life. Abraham's faith fathered a new people in a new land. The faith of Moses' parents saved the life of their son. The faith of Rahab hid the spies. So what is the connection between our faith and our worship? Can we worship God and not deal with loving the people around us, with throwing off sin, with life in this world?




What is faith? _____


