### Resurrection vs. Revivification

Revivification is when someone who dies comes back to life, only to die again. There are many examples of this throughout Scripture. Resurrection differs in that it describes the death and return to physical life for eternity, never to die again. (Driscoll and Breshears 280)

According to research done by N.T. Wright, Christian belief in resurrection was novel to the ancient world, definitely counter-cultural. Even among the Jews, the doctrine of resurrection was debated.

The Sadducees did not believe in it at all, and the general Jewish teaching was of the resurrection of the Jewish nation alone when the history of mankind was completed. Neverthe-less, it is Jewish Scripture that holds the multiple prophecies about the resurrection of Christ. The prophecies of Isaiah in 53:8-12 were given some 700 years beforehand. Jesus also predicted His own resurrection. It might be within human power to make some of the other prophecies come true (like riding a colt into Jerusalem) but to rise from the dead definitely requires divine action!
