Feast of Trumpets

Rosh Hashanah is another name for Yom Teruah, or the Feast of Trumpets. It literally means "the head of the year" and marks the beginning of the Jewish civil year. It falls in the month of Tishri, which is the seventh month on the Jewish religious calendar, and the first month of their civil calendar. It falls in Sept/Oct of the calendar we use, the Gregorian calendar.

The Feast of Trumpets was the first of a trio of the autumn Feasts of the Lord, sometimes collectively referred to as the Feast of Tabernacles and including the all important Day of Atone-called Yom Kippur.

The main purpose of the Feast of Trumpets was to announce the arrival of the seventh month and herald the final season of the Lord's Feasts. Like a judge hammers his gavel to call attention to the beginning of a session of court, at the end of which a verdict will be announced, the Feast of Trumpets announced that in a matter of days it would be time for the Day of Atonement, so get ready! The trial is beginning, and in ten days, on the Day of Atonement, the verdict will be announced. This feast season would be the last time the Jewish males would be required to travel to Jerusalem until the following year at Passover.

I have served on a jury twice, but I have never been the one trial. What must it be like for the guilty to sit there as the condemning evidence is presented, and all the dastardly deeds are brought to light? What is it like to know your guilt, know what you deserve, then sit helplessly waiting for the verdict and sentence to be announced?

That is exactly the position the Jewish people experienced every year from the time of the blast that announced the ten day trial that would culminate in the Day of Atonement, when the verdict would be announced. It would be a sober time of realizing your sinfulness, and what it should cost you. There was no way to undo what had been done, it was too

Ten Days of Repentance

The ten days beginning with the Feast of Trumpets and continuing until the Day of Atonement are known as the Ten Days of Awe, or Repentance. (Robinson 95) It is during this time that God is judging mankind. So, the tradition for the Jewish people during this time is to be introspective, reviewing the "crimes" against God they have witnessed themselves commit throughout the prior year. They are to be extra mindful of asking anyone they have offended for forgiveness, and engaging in prayer, repentance, acts of charity, and anything that will better prepare them to face God's judgment. It is a signal that God is opening The Book that records man's deeds. The trumpet call signals an arousal of awareness that will lead to repentance. It is a call for God's people, and ultimately all of mankind, to turn from their evil ways. It is a recognition of their life, and their eternity, being in Someone else's hands. 


